BACKUP AND RESTORE

To ensure that a malfunction won't cause you to lose the information stored inside Newton, you should always keep a recent backup copy of your information. You can keep a backup copy on an optional storage card or on a computer, using the optional connecting kit.



 Insert a storage card. (See "Inserting and Ejecting Cards" in Chapter 23.)

Warning: Each storage card can store only one backup copy. If there's already a backup copy on the card, it will be erased to make room for the new one.




If something causes you to lose the information stored in Newton, you can use a backup copy on a memory card to restore it.

Warning: Before Newton restores the information from the memory card, it erases everything already stored in Newton.

- Insert the memory card that contains the backup copy you want to restore. (See "Inserting and Ejecting Cards" in Chapter 23.)
- 2. Tap to open the Extras drawer if it's not already open.







MAKING A BACKUP COPY ON A COMPUTER

If you have an optional connecting kit, you can store backup copies of Newton's information on your Macintosh or Windows computer. See the manual that comes with your connecting kit for details.

SECURITY

If you store private information on Newton, you may want to protect it from curious eyes. You can take any of these three approaches:

- · Set a password.
- · Keep information on a storage card which you can lock up.
- Lock up Newton when you're not using it.

SETTING A PASSWORD


You may create a password which is required every time you turn on Newton.

Important: If you set a password and then forget it, you will not be able to use Newton again until you return it to Apple. Apple may charge a fee to reset your password.



Note: You will be asked to enter the password every time you turn on Newton. To make sure you don't leave Newton on, and thus unprotected, you can tell Newton to turn itself off after a period of inactivity. See "Adjusting the Sleep Time" in Chapter 23.

After you set a password, you see this message when you turn on Newton:

- I. Write the password.
- If it's correct, this image goes away and you can begin your work.



USING A MEMORY CARD


The most effective way to secure your information is to lock it up. If you don't have room to lock up Newton itself, you can store the sensitive information on a memory card, then lock up the memory card when you're not using it.

Note, however, that you cannot store some information on a memory card, such as the appointments and to-do items in the Date Book.

To move existing information onto a memory card, see "Moving Existing Information to or from a Memory Card" in Chapter 25. To tell Newton to store all new information on a memory card, see "Storing New Information on a Memory Card," also in Chapter 25.


COPYING DATA FROM SHARP OZ/IQ TO NEWTON

To transfer information from any series 7000, 8000, or 9000 Sharp OZ/IQ device to your Newton, follow these steps:

 Connect the Sharp device to your Newton using a RS-422 Level Converter (Sharp part number CE135T).

- On the Sharp device, press the correct keys to put it into PC Link Mode. (See the manual that came with the device.)
- 3. Tap to open the Extras drawer if it's not already open.





- To avoid duplicate Newton entries, import each Sharp application only once.
- Not every Sharp OZ/IQ model has every application.
 Consult the manual that came with your device to see which it has.
- If Newton tells you it couldn't import the information, you





MESSAGES FROM NEWTON

When a message appears, you can do the following:

- To see recent messages, tap the up arrow.
- To see a list of recent messages, tap the dot

"Newton is out of memory."

You must either provide Newton with more memory or delete some of the information you have stored. You can provide Newton with more memory by inserting a storage card (Chapter 25).

You can make more room by deleting information you no longer need, such as completed to-do items, past appointments, and outdated notes. For more suggestions, see "Conserving Memory" in Chapter 24.

"There is nothing to undo."

Newton can only undo the last two changes it made, so if you tap Undo more than twice in a row, it can no longer find anything to undo. Also, there are some actions Newton cannot undo, such as backing up and restoring information.

"Newton still needs the card you removed. Please insert it now."

Reinsert the card. If for some reason the card isn't available, you can continue working by using the Newton pen to press the Reset button inside the battery compartment. However, if you fail to reinsert the card, you will lose all the information stored on it.

WRITING, DRAWING, AND THE RECOGNIZERS

I want Newton to convert my handwriting to printed text, but it doesn't.

Make sure this text button is darkened. To avoid having your letters mistaken for shapes, make sure the shapes button is not darkened.

I saved my original handwriting. Can I convert it to text now?

You must have the text button turned on at the time you're writing for Newton to convert it to printed text. Write the text again with the text recognizer turned on.

Newton misinterpreted a word I wrote.

Normally, the text recognizer uses two word lists to figure out what words you're writing. If the word you wrote isn't on either list, Newton will misinterpret it. The two lists are: (1) Newton's own built-in list containing thousands of words, names, and abbreviations; and (2) a list of words you teach Newton using the correction keyboard.

- To correct a word, tap it twice and use the correction keyboard. See "Using the Correction Keyboard" in Chapter 5.
- Make sure you have the appropriate options checked in the Recognizers preferences area. The "words in word lists" option should be checked. See "Recognition Preferences" in Chapter 5.

Newton interprets my handwriting too slowly.

Follow the suggestions in "Improving Text Recognition" in Chapter 5.

Long spidery lines appear on the screen while I'm writing or drawing

Be careful not to rest your hand on the screen while you're writing or drawing.

When I write numbers, names, phone numbers, dates, or times, Newton interprets them as words.

Make sure you have the "numbers," "telephone numbers," "dates," or "times of day" options checked in the Recognizers preferences area. See "Recognition Preferences" in Chapter 5.

When I draw a shape, Newton changes it to be something else.

The shape recognizer can clean up your shapes. You can control how the shape recognizer works by setting options in the Interpreter preferences area. See "Recognition Preferences" in Chapter 5.

My writing or drawing comes out a little bit away from the tip of the pen.

You should realign the pen and the screen:.

- 1. Tap Extras.
- 2. Tap Prefs.
- 3. Tap Pen Alignment.
- 4. Tap Realign.

POWER AND BATTERIES

I can't turn on the device.

 If you have connected the power adapter to Newton, make sure it's plugged into a working outlet. If it's plugged into a power strip, make sure the power strip is turned on. If you are using batteries, try a fresh set. See "Replacing the Main Batteries" in Chapter 23.

I can't move the orange switch in the battery compartment to change the batteries

The orange switch is designed to prevent you from accidentally removing both the main and backup batteries at the same time, which could cause you to lose all the information stored in Newton.

- If the orange switch is stuck in the Replace Backup position, make sure the small round backup battery is completely and correctly installed.
- If the orange switch is stuck in the Replace Main position, make sure the battery holder (or the rechargeable battery pack) is completely and correctly installed.

My batteries don't last as long as they used to.

Setting Newton to receive beams automatically (see "Automating the Process of Receiving Beams" in Chapter 10.) uses up a lot of battery power. Also, the more you use the communication port for faxing, mailing, and printing, the faster the battery will run out. See Chapter 23 for more suggestions on saving power.

If you're using rechargeable batteries, they may have reached the end of their life. You should dispose of them safely and legally and get some new ones.

PASSWORDS

I forgot my Newton password.

You must return Newton to someone authorized to reset the password. In the United States, call I-800-SOS-APPLE for specific directions.

I remember my Newton password but Newton doesn't recognize it when I write it.

Tap the misinterpreted password twice and correct it as described in "Correcting Misinterpreted Text or Changing it Back to Handwriting" in Chapter 5.

I forgot my e-mail password.

See the Using Electronic Mail booklet.

THE SCREEN

Long spidery lines appear on the screen while I'm writing or drawing

Be careful not to rest your hand on the screen while you're writing or drawing.

The screen appears too light or too dark.

- · Adjust the contrast control in the Extras drawer.
- Adjust your viewing angle.
- Make sure the device is at room temperature.

If you adjust the contrast so far in one direction that you can no longer see the screen, tap Undo. If that doesn't work, tap the up arrow.

PRINTING, FAXING, BEAMING, AND MAILING

Your return address is missing from faxes or printouts

You haven't filled in the personal information in the Preferences, as explained in "Personal Information" in Chapter 1.

I've connected my printer, but a message in the Out Box tells me the print attempt failed.

- Turn printer off and then, wait 30 seconds, then turn it back on.
- Check all the cable connections.

 Make sure you have selected the correct type of printer.
 See "Choosing the Printer Type in the Print Box" in Chapter 8.

OTHER

The device is wet

Warning: If Newton gets wet while it's plugged in, you run the risk of electrocution. Turn off the circuit it's plugged into before you do anything else.

You should not allow the unit to become wet. However, if it does get wet, remove the main batteries and allow the unit to dry for at least 24 hours.

The time or date is wrong.

- Set the time zone as described in "Time Zone" in Chapter 1.
- 2. Set the date and local time as described in "Date and Time" in Chapter 1.

I tapped some buttons and now I don't know where I am.

Go back to the Notepad by putting away everything else on your screen. To put away something, tap the X in the corner.

Many of my notes or cards seem to be missing

- You may have asked to see only one file folder. See the instructions in "Looking at One Folder or at All Folders" in Chapter 7, choosing to see all.
- If you use a storage card, it may not be installed.

Newton dials the wrong number


You may not have set all your calling options correct for the phone from which your placing the call. See "Calling Options" in Chapter 14.


I get a message telling me I can't store anything on a storage card because it's protected

Unprotect the card as described in Chapter 25.

Undo doesn't work.

The Undo button only undoes changes to your information. It doesn't affect navigation—going from one area to another, moving up and down with the arrow button, and so on. It also doesn't affect backing up or restoring.

- Write capital letters, tall letters (such as t and i), colons, semicolons, and exclamation points so they use the whole height of the line. Other characters should be half as high.
- Put a full space between words. Avoid extra width which can cause Newton to insert a tab.
- · Write in straight lines, from left to right.
- Don't scrunch words at the edge of the screen.
- Make parentheses bigger than tall letters.
- Don't go back to a letter you've already written.
- · Don't pause in the middle of writing a word.
- Use thicker ink for best recognition. You can set the thickness in Styles area of the Extras drawer.
- Keep punctuation near the word. If the mark turns into an I, you're leaving too much space.

Setting Preference for: Best-Recognition

- In Recognizers preferences, tap Review My Word List and remove any short words you don't use and add any unusual names and words you will use. Turn on "words in word lists" and turn off "words not in word lists." Turn off as many of the other text preferences as you can.
- In Handwriting Style preferences, set "Recognize My Handwriting" as far right as you can without sacrificing accuracy. Turn on the "Learn My Writing Style" option.
- In Letter Style preferences, mark how often you use each letter shape.

INSTALLING THE BATTERIES

I Place Newton screen-side down onto a surface that won't damage the screen.

2 Use your thumb to slide off the panel that covers the batterijes.

CAUTION If the backup battery is inserted incorrectly, it can explode. Be careful to insert the battery + side up. See other cautions related to replacing the battery in Chapter 23.



Using Newton safely

- Keep electronic or paper copies of everything you store in Newton. Though designed and tested to store your information safely day in and day out, like all electronic devices, Newton can unexpectedly fail and forget your information. Chapter 26 discusses ways to make backup copies of your information.
- Be careful not to scratch Newton's screen. Use only plastic-tipped pens intended for use with a touchsensitive screen. Don't use ink pens or any other sharp object. Always store Newton in a case that has a stiff plate that can protect the screen.
- Never remove both the backup battery and the main batteries at the same time. Removing both sets of batteries at the same time will erase all the information stored in Newton.
- Keep Newton dry.
